

Rules for Admission in M.Ed. Course :

1. There is a Pre-Masters of Education Test hereinafter called PMET for admission to M.Ed. Colleges of Rajasthan. OMR Application Forms for the same are being invited by University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. Candidates securing at least 55% marks in the general category (male and female) in the B.Ed. examination of University of Rajasthan or any other University recognised as equivalent to and fulfilling the other requirements for admission to M.Ed. Course prescribed hereinafter will be eligible to apply for admission to M.Ed. Course through PMET. However Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes as well as physically challenged candidates, widow, divorcee having at least 50% marks in aggregate in the B.Ed. examination will be eligible to apply for admission.
2. The candidates appearing in the qualifying examination shall have to present their Mark sheet of the qualifying examination showing their eligibility by the date decided by this office and declared with first round of On-line Counselling Programme.
3. To qualify the PMET, candidates shall require to secure at least 40% marks in the test. There is no provision of grace marks. Moreover, his/her name should figure in the merit list, within the total number of seats available in different categories. Merely securing 40% marks will not confirm the admission in M.Ed. Course.
4. The following rules are made by the government of Rajasthan for M.Ed. course :
 - (i) Out of the total number of seats, not exceeding 05% seats will be filled in on the basis of overall merit, irrespective of the State to which the candidate belongs provided that **merit of a candidate from**

outside Rajasthan is not less than the merit of the last candidate admitted belonging to Rajasthan in a general category. The remaining seats will be available to the candidates who are bonafide residents of Rajasthan State.

(ii) Other reservations are made as given hereunder:-

I	For candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes	%
I	For candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribes	%
I	For candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes	%
I	For women (out of which 8% seats are reserved for widow and 2% for divorced women).	%
Y	For physically challenged	%
Y	For an in-service or an Ex-serviceman defence personnel or for his/her ward.	%

In case candidates under reserved category are not available then their seats will be filled by candidates of general category.

5. Candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes of Rajasthan are required to produce a Certificate to that effect from a District Magistrate/Sub-Division Magistrate/Tehsildar.
6. In case of a married woman, married with a bonafide resident of Rajasthan, the place of bonafide residence of her husband is considered as her bonafide residence in Rajasthan, provided a bonafide residence certificate of her husband and marriage certificate obtained from District Magistrate are produced alongwith OMR application form for appearing in the test.
7. Widow women are required to produce the death certificate of her husband and Divorced woman are required to produce a certificate in the shape of

decision of the Court to the effect that she has been divorced, and an affidavit to the effect that she has not married again duly attested by Notary.

8. Such wards of defence personnel and Central Govt, employees, who have/had been posted outside Rajasthan but such defence personnel/Central Government employees originally belong to Rajasthan, are considered eligible for admission to M.Ed. course provided a bonafide residence-certificate from a competent Magistrate and a certificate from the employer are submitted along with application form for appearing in PMET.
9. False statement of facts noticed at any stage, automatically results in cancellation of candidature and admission to the course, if it has already been made, will still stand cancelled.
10. Out of the total eligible candidates, firstly students of general category are selected. Then students are given admission in the reserved categories. In case the seats remain vacant in reserved category, the following seats are transferred into general category and the seats are then allotted according to their merit.
11. Allotment of Teacher Education Institution is made through ON-LINE counseling. The Result is made available on the website. For information of the candidates a notification regarding declaration of the result is also published in the leading newspapers of Rajasthan. Marksheets of the candidates is not send by post. The same can be downloaded from the website of the PMET. The counseling programme is also published in leading newspapers of Rajasthan is also available on PMET website alongwith the instructions regarding their participation in ON-LINE Counseling. Candidates are bound to follow the same. Candidates are advised to keep constant watch on the leading newspapers of Rajasthan and website of the PMET on/after the declaration of their result. The candidates

who do not perform ON-LINE counseling or refuse to accept the allotted college through ON-LINE counseling, will lose their PMET merit position and their chance for admission to M.Ed. course is not reconsidered. After allotment of a college any request for transfer or change of college (individual or mutual) is not entertained in any case. The admission fee deposited by a candidate is not returned in any condition if he/she reported on-line through the college allotted him/her.

12. A candidate is admitted in any Teacher Education Institution in the State. Admission to a Teacher Education Institution in a particular District/place cannot be claimed by any candidate on the basis of belonging to that District/ place.
13. Women candidates are allotted Women's Teacher Education institution according to their merit. In case of non-availability of such institutions, they are allotted co-education institutions.

A. Guidelines regarding admission to Pre Masters Education Test.

1. In the very nature of competitive Examination, no syllabus is prescribed. It is an exercise to pick-up the best. However, the following pages contain a broad outline.
2. The PMET Examination consists of one question paper containing following four Sections:
 - Social and Philosophical Foundations of Education
 - Psychology of Learning
 - Educational Management and Educational Technology
 - Teaching Efficiency
3. The question paper consists of 200 questions (50 questions from each section). All questions in Question-Paper are objective type multiple choice questions with at least four alternative answers.

4. The Paper is set both in English and Hindi except for the Language Proficiency Section. In case of discrepancy in options of answers or in question paper the English version is treated as final.
5. The duration of the paper is 3 hours.
6. Each question carries 3 marks and the maximum marks in the paper are 600.
7. Full 3 marks are awarded for each correct answer and one mark will be deducted for every wrong answer.
8. The question paper of each section will be in the form of a test booklet containing 50 questions bearing number 1,2,3,..... 50. There would be at least four alternative suggested answers (A) (B) (C) (D) etc. to each question.
9. The question booklets are arranged in different combinations. It is also ensured by the candidate that the serial number of the Question booklet is correctly and accurately written at the prescribed place on the Answer Sheet and correct circles corresponding to the figures are darkened very carefully.

At the time of reporting of the students at the college, her eligibility criteria of admission into the said course are verified by the admission committee and the head of the institution.
